### Dissertation abstract

Two dissertation abstracts are needed for the dissertation form: a scientific abstract and a popular abstract. The scientific abstract is in English and the popular one in Swedish and/or Finnish. The recommended maximum length of each is one sheet (2400 characters).

The popular dissertation abstract provides the general public with information on your research. It will be read by people who are not necessarily aware of the approach and methods prevalent in your field. The abstract should therefore be as easy-to-understand as possible. The general public is especially interested in innovations, the results; relevance to other research and possible practical applications.

In the personal information field, you can tell about yourself within the limits of one paragraph: your date and place of birth, high school you graduated etc. This field is used for possible press release.

Abstracts will be approved by E-thesis personnel before they are made available to the general public at the E-thesis service.
